Through the performance and advancement of symphonic music, Lincoln's Symphony Orchestra will educate, entertain and enrich current and potential audiences.

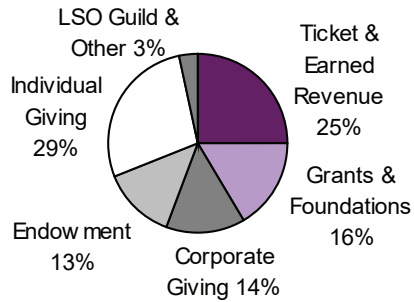

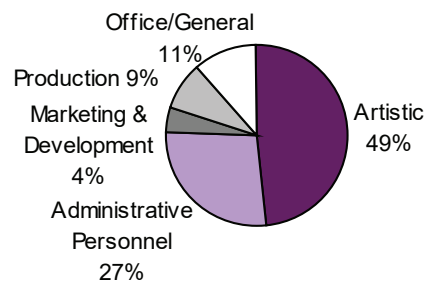

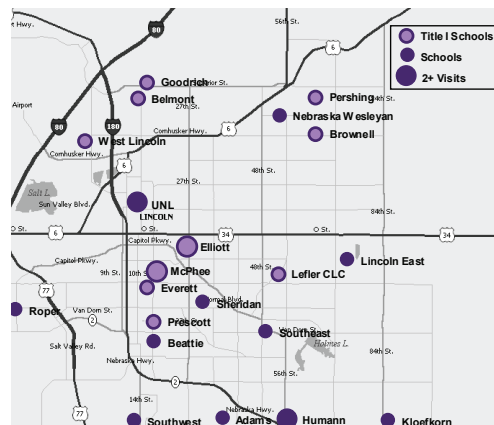

The Lincoln Symphony Orchestra Foundation, a separate 501(c)(3), manages an endowment with a current value of \$2,799,182. LSO is the sole beneficiary of this endowment, and receives a quarterly distribution of 4.25% of the market value calculated over a 12-quarter rolling average.

Lincoln's Symphony Orchestra Guild, a separate 501(c)(3), is a support organization with the mission to stimulate community interest and support for LSO through educational and fundraising activities. Each year they plan and execute fundraising events for the sole benefit of LSO.

### EDUCATION & OUTREACH ACTIVITIES



Through our education programs and school visits with our Music Director and guest artists this year, we impacted:

- 6,270 Elementary school students
- 150 Middle school students
- 550 High school students
- 756 College students

More than 2,020 students attended last season using the Lienemann Charitable Foundation Student Tickets for only \$5.

Twice per season there is an educational dress rehearsal where students, teachers, and parents can attend a 30-minute talk about the repertoire and rehearsal techniques prior to the final dress rehearsal.



### YOUNG ARTIST COMPETITION

Music students under the age of 20 are invited to compete for a cash prize, private coaching, and opportunity to solo with the orchestra. Winners of LSO's Young Artist Competition have gone on to perform with major orchestras, pursue teaching careers, and some are now members of Lincoln's Symphony Orchestra.

### LINCOLN YOUTH SYMPHONY SIDE-BY-SIDE

Each season, Maestro Polochick rehearses with LYS, then they join LSO musicians for a rehearsal and performance on an LSO classical concert. Each musician is given a complimentary ticket for the remainder of the concert, and discounted tickets are provided for their families.

### CONCERT PHOTOBOOTH

During intermission at each classical concert, LSO provides a photobooth with a local professional photographer. Students, families, and patrons are welcome to take their symphonic memory home, free of charge. Some photoboos even come complete with concert-themed costumes!



### FAMILY LITERACY PARTNERSHIP

Family Literacy, an English Language Learning program for parents and children through Lincoln Public Schools, improves educational outcomes for students and increases their parents' literacy and employment skills. LSO provides a cultural literacy component for the immigrant and refugee families in the program, including over 800 tickets annually with free transportation to select performances.

## LSO'S ANNUAL YOUNG PEOPLE'S CONCERTS



LSO's Young People's Concerts reach more than 4,500 students each year through 3 day-time performances. Local collegiate music education students develop lesson plans to prepare students, so that their field trip to the Lied Center to attend an LSO concert is the culmination of their study of the orchestra. This event is an integrated component in the Lincoln Public Schools curriculum for 4th graders.

## LSO'S MOVE TO THE LIED CENTER AND AFFORDABLE TICKET PRICES

Since moving to the Lied Center, our audience has more than doubled (from 5,440 people in 2010-2011 to over 13,000 in 2013-2014), and the total number of households served has more than tripled. On a scale of 1-10, patrons valued LSO at 8.5 for the perceived value of the experience compared to ticket price.

7% have a household income of less than \$25,000

15% come from outside of Lincoln

20% are in the young professional age range (18-40). The majority (33%) are between 56-70.

## BIOGRAPHIES OF PERSONNEL



Music Director Edward Polochick resides in Baltimore and is the Director of Choral Activities and Associate Director of Orchestras at the Peabody Conservatory of Music. He has been Music Director of Lincoln's Symphony Orchestra since 1998. Polochick is the founder and artistic director of Concert Artists of Baltimore and is highly sought after as a guest conductor throughout the country for all age levels.



Resident Conductor Tyler White has been the Director of Orchestras at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln's Glenn Korff School of Music since 1994. White is also an award-winning composer, specifically recognized for his opera *O Pioneers*, the first ever operatic treatment of a Willa Cather novel. He conducts LSO's annual holiday concert and Young People's Concerts.



Concertmaster Anton Miller has appeared throughout the United States and abroad as a soloist, chamber musician, recitalist and pedagogue. He has released several recordings for violin solo, violin duet, and chamber music, and is on the violin and chamber music faculty at New York University and The Hart School at the University of Connecticut.



Since May 2005, Executive Director Barbara Zach has led a talented administrative team to work with the board in implementing LSO's artistic vision. She is a graduate of the League of American Orchestras' Executive Leadership Program and the Leadership Lincoln Fellows Class XXII, she received a 2010 Governor's Arts Award for Emerging Leaders, and received the 2015 Alumni Achievement Award from the Hixson-Lied College of Fine & Performing Arts.

**Community service:** Lincoln's Symphony Orchestra's musicians, board, and staff serve on more than 30 non-profit boards, including Friendship Home, Rotary International, Food Bank of Lincoln, and many other arts organizations. More than half of LSO musicians donate their time each month to volunteer (for organizations such as TeamMates and the Nebraska Community Blood Bank) and more than half also volunteer their musical talent at churches and schools. Most of our musicians make a living playing and teaching music in the Lincoln and Omaha areas.
